
Dist 30 Meeting Minutes (Area 75) Aug 2, 2024 6:30pm at the Wesley Ave Alano Club www.rockcoaa.net

Last chance to get meeting schedule changes in before Pete prints them off. Only known additional change is that the Gifts Group needs a new contact person.


